It's just kind of a drab time for us.

It's also a time of continued adjustment in our marriage as we're living in one bedroom and it literally feels at times like we are ALWAYS in each other's way. Thank God for the terrace so we have at least a little more space. Our monthly date night keeps getting put off and we've had to deal with an ongoing illness and the struggles and tiredness that comes with that. Kids Restaurant

This is where we have been trying to go on our date night. It is a restaurant completely run by kids (under adult supervision). The project was started to teach children work, social, and team development skills. They also take classes to learn about restaurant management. The children go to the market to buy all the food for a 3-course meal served Friday nights. Half the children cook the meal & half serve the meal. They switch every week so they get to experience both. They also change the country/theme every month so the children learn about other food/cultures.

God reminded us that rain makes things grow. As one of our teachers shared with us in missions school life is like being a seed. Then to make matters worse the rain comes and it feels good at first after being sun-scorched but then it starts to feel like too much and we might start to feel like we're drowning. This is the point where most people "crawl out" and give up. But if we'll just hang on during the rainy seasons the sun will return again and growth will start and slowly we'll push our way out of the dirt and grow into what we were designed to be in the first place. However, if we give up during the rainy season we'll never see that growth and we'll always be JUST a seed.

So while it seems like the rainy season is taking over right now, while it seems like we're just plugging on with learning Spanish, doing the day to day normal stuff, and facing the challenges that sometimes come in life, we know that this is a time of growth. God is growing us in so many ways so that we can be what He wants us to be for the ministry He's called us to. So we can have the basic language skills we need to continue to grow in the Spanish language, so we know how to have patience, to be still and wait on the Lord, so we can have so many of the things we need and are going to continue to need in this ministry.
