We are moving forward by integrating with the church's ministries

We are continuing to have meetings to discuss our integration with Iglesia Cristiana Comunitaria Ciudad de Refugio (City of Refuge Christian Community Church). Looking forward, we are going to be helping them start a women's version of Celebrate Recovery (CR). You may recall that we are products of and leaders in the CR program thanks to York Christian Church (YCC) and its wonderful staff that run it there. The pastor here is excited to be able to integrate this program for the entire family beyond its current use which is to minister to local alcoholics and drug users. We are impatiently waiting for the Spanish version of Celebration

Station, the children's version of CR, to be released so we can begin to help children who have been victims of abuse, subjected to the atrocities of living in a gang-plagued area, and learn how to deal with life's hurts, hang-ups, and habits in a healthy manner so they won't need to attend the adult version!

Additionally, Missy will be integrating with their house of refuge program which helps abused women and children with their legal proceedings while Dylan will be assisting the pastor in starting a 2-year spiritual leadership program for local church leaders and pastors.
