We are currently investigating ways to help some of the children who are struggling in school. The school system here does not serve the students very well and there are some who are repeating their current grade for the 3rd or 4th time! We want to find ways to better invest in these kids' lives so that they can be the link that breaks the cycle of poverty in their families.
